Batteries are a powerful and convenient energy source, but they are also a major fire risk.

If not stored or disposed of correctly, a seemingly safe battery can ignite and may even explode.

In fact, research among local authorities* found that there were over 700 fires in 2022 due to improper battery disposal – and the problem is increasing.

Please do not put batteries in your Shred-it console. They can cause a massive safety risk to your customer service representative, and Shred-it team members at our shredding facilities - as well as having a potential impact on local emergency services.

When it comes to batteries and products containing batteries – think, don't bin it.



Always recycle your batteries Help prevent fires in the UK waste system



Here are some top tips for correct battery disposal

- Never put batteries in a rubbish or recycling bin
- Tape/cover the terminals of batteries before recycling them
- Make sure they are completely discharged before recycling them

Where to recycle batteries

- Shops and supermarkets: many retail stores offer battery recycling bins.
- Household recycling centres: check with your local authority
