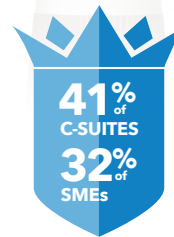
have a policy in place, but say not all employees are aware of it

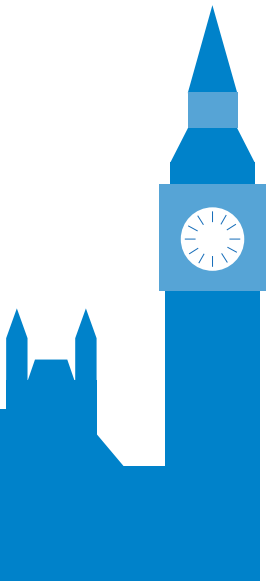
